Well it had to happen didn't it?

All the signs were there, beginning with a 20 goal win over the same team in a trial not so long ago, training form which has been identified and critiqued as sub standard and an attitude which reeks of selfishness rather than team, yes hindsight tells me we had it coming to us. The problem was from 3.00 p.m. on Sunday I couldn't have envisaged how far we could have slipped in such a short time. Winning certainly covers a multitude of sins but when your not they are immediately obvious and so highly visible. What's even more galling is that I'm more to blame than anyone for pumping our tyres up after 4 meaningless trial game wins and a couple of easy wins to start the season proper. Postulating on our prospects in such bullish fashion after the first game for points, arrogantly suggesting we already know we're the side to beat now looks to be ridiculous and as of this week unrealistic.

I can tell you one thing, the personnel hasn't changed markedly since game 1 when "all played well" so if talent doesn't dissolve what's happened? A very talented side at this level lacking the passion for the contest and going through the motions was shown the way by an honest, hard working, more committed team. The signs were very ordinary right from the start when we were down 6 goals to 2 at quarter time after being totally smashed at the centre bounces on virtually every occasion but worse still unless a message comes out to man up no one seems to be either smart enough or willing enough to take it upon themselves to initiate the move themselves. Perhaps they don't perceive it as being a problem they are responsible for or perhaps don't even see it as a problem. The on ball brigade are charged with the highly sought after role of having considerable freedom to initiate play and get their hands on the ball as much as possible. However, when virtually to a man their opposite numbers are controlling the play the ability to follow an opponent who is having a greater influence also didn't appear to be something that was as obvious as I hoped it might be.

Having recovered in the second quarter to be only a goal down at half time normal transmission was anticipated to resume, it didn't. To be treated to a 10 goal to 3 second half wasn't quite what I had in mind but now that it's happened we'll see just what direction we take from this point on. The words "wake up call" spring to

mind so I'll be very keen to see how the approach is on the track this week, there's only one way to come back from such a meek performance and that is strongly and confidently. Let's see how it plays out with the big game against the top side Eastern Park this week. We'll hope to regain our credibility and self respect with a more robust showing this week; I'm more interested than anyone to see how it all goes.

Best players? I saw quite a few from Hope Valley I liked but they aren't the one's I'm supposed to be talking about but it would be a lot easier I can tell you. One noticeable exception was Ben Mutton who unlike numerous others, simply shuts his mouth, gets on with the job, puts his head over the ball, does the hard things, the team things, the sacrificial acts, virtually all of the things that most WON'T do and he does them all without ever questioning why or whingeing about it. He sacrificed his individual game for the betterment of the team, there are very few of our guys who could do that, stopping their key player who was runner up in the medal last year, a job expertly done. Our 2 main forwards Mattress Min and Jay-Lo Liddell kicked 3 goals 2 each out of a total of 8.8. so I guess they might rate a mention. Luke Bollmeyer played for his school the day before and suffered a heavy knock and it would've been easy for him to have put the hand up and said "can't play" and his effort was solid, another sacrificial act on a day when we didn't have many.

The rest were a little too patchy to get excited about, we'll see if this week brings a change of attitude on the track, I'd suggest if it's important enough to be willing to make the effort it'll soon be obvious to me, it shows first on the track and then in games, regardless of previous (positive) results I always knew we still had plenty to improve on, after this week I'm beginning to realize I underestimated just exactly how much by a massive margin. A job worth doing is worth doing well, we'll see where we end up this week. Things have to change.
