Henley at Henley is probably one of the toughest road trips in the Amateur League these days. Again we started the 3rd very well, holding Henley who had the wind again. However our lapse in concentration cost us the game in the next 10 minutes. Some poor decision making and some in-different decisions from the men in orange allowed Henley to put the game beyond doubt. They kicked 5 goals in as many minutes and went into three quarter time with a 7 goal lead (fairly defining given the weather).

Our last was slightly better, but again could not put it on the scoreboard with our forwards having a dog of a day.

We now turn to Broadview at home, our first game at Pertaringa since Round 5. Broadies have had a good month of footy and this is a must win game for us to keep in touch. We hope to welcome back a few of our key players and really get the pressure for spots, which has been missing due to the injuries we have been carrying. Our next month will be dedicated to settling our side and really playing some consistent footy across four quarters - this has to start this week.

To the A Grade squad - the Challenge is now before us, it is time for actions - concentrate on your own game, make sure you dominate your opponents - your team mates and the result will no doubt follow!
